FROM THE RECTOR

Max Lucado reminds us of the story of the Taj Mahal, one of the most beautiful and costly tombs in the world. The legends which surround its building are all fascinating. But, there is one that haunts and disturbs.

Shah-Jahan, the powerful Mogul emperor, was in grief. His favorite wife had died. He loved her deeply and he was devastated by her loss. He decided to honor her by building an incredible temple, the likes of which the world had never seen. The temple would serve as her tomb. It would be a memorial tribute to her, and a dramatic symbol of his love.

Her coffin was placed in the center of a large parcel of land and construction of the temple began around it. No expense would be spared. Her final resting place would be magnificent and breath-taking.

But as the weeks turned into months, the Shah's grief was eclipsed by his passion for the building project. He no longer missed her. He hardly thought of her at all anymore. He no longer mourned her absence. He was now totally consumed with the details of the building project. It's all he thought about.

Then, one day while hurriedly walking from one side of the construction site to the other, he accidentally bumped his leg against a wooden box. The prince was irritated. Impatiently, he brushed the dust off his leg and ordered the workers to throw the box out

immediately. What was that box doing here in the middle of the building anyway? Get it out of here right now!

You have already guessed. The box held the remains of his beloved wife. Shah threw out her coffin. He forgot she was there. The one the temple was built for was cast out. The one who inspired the whole project in the first place was now forgotten ... but, the temple was erected anyway. Isn't that amazing?

Could someone build a temple and forget why? Could someone sculpt a tribute and forget the hero? Could someone celebrate an anniversary and forget the guest of honor? Could someone create a memorial and forget who is supposed to be remembered? It happens.

This dramatic ancient legend is a painfully relevant parable for the way some people celebrate Christmas today ... and the point is clear. Sometimes we get so involved in the tasks and details of Christmas that we forget the one we are honoring. Isn't this our problem? Yours and mine? We get so busy, so tired, so preoccupied with the incessant demands on our crowded lives and this New Year that we shut out the very birth of the Master we so long to know.

Christmas continues, as a season and as a way of life. This New Year let us live into the meaning of Christmas each and every day!

PASTORAL CARE

I hereby resolve to...

Here we go again. The New Year and the time to make annual resolutions. Last year I planned to exercise more and joined Curves. Apparently, you actually have to *go* to make it work. Who knew?

So this year, my resolution is to exercise my spiritual self, my soul. Now that I have found a Morning Prayer App for my Droid (The Daily Office from The Mission of St. Clare), my prayer discipline is getting better. But what about evangelism? This part of my soul is weaker than I would like and yet we are all commanded by Jesus to go out into the world and spread the good news of the Gospel. But how?



St. Francis of Assisi is attributed to the saying, "Preach the Gospel at all times and when necessary use words." But again the question is, how? Perhaps another saying of this saint expresses evangelism in a way we can better understand "Start by doing what's necessary; then do what's possible; and suddenly you are doing the impossible."

If God asked St. Michael's Church to feed a multitude of over 300,000 people we might say that would be impossible. But Luke wrote, "What is impossible with men is possible with God," Luke 18:27. God indeed accomplished the impossible here at St. Michael's. For more than 20 years, every Tuesday, The Gathering has fed over 300

people. That comes to more than 312,000 meals for the homeless men, women and children staying at the Coalition for the Homeless!

If God asked us to give free sports physicals to a thousand kids, we might say that would be impossible. Yet we have already given more than 600 physicals. Next year, with your help, we'll be at the Citrus Bowl and *Be A Player* will go beyond that number to meet the needs of more than 1,000 children!

If God asked us to provide a Christmas for children who would otherwise not receive, would we be willing to donate 250 Bags of Joy? We would and we did.

"Start by doing what's necessary," said St. Francis. What is necessary for the next year for St. Michael's? Some people think that ideas for ministry ought to come from the clergy.

But in the Prayer Book laity is the first named ministers of the church. And frankly, the best ideas come from the congregation. So I want to ask you, what impossible thing might we do next year to advance the kingdom of God? What New Year's resolution might you, personally make to Jesus, be a part of that effort?

An ancient African proverb teaches that it takes a village to raise a child. I disagree. It takes a family. We are a family. Together we will take the impossible and make it possible.
